Summary of Key Government Support Measures for Beauty Services Industry

Updated: 5 June 2020

Includes Enhanced Measures from the Fortitude Budget





Cashflow / Financing Support

- 1. Temporary Bridging Loan (TBL) [To apply, please contact existing bankers e.g. DBS, OCBC, UOB]
 - Expanded to all sectors from 1 Apr 2020 to 31 Mar 2020
 - Max loan quantum of \$5 mil (increased from \$1 mil previously), with max repayment period of 5 years
 - Government's risk share: 90% (applies to loans initiated from 8 Apr 2020 to 31 Mar 2021)
 - Interest rate: capped at <u>5% per annum</u>
 - Coys may request for deferment of principle repayment for 1 year, subject to assessment by PFIs

2. SME Working Capital Loan (WCL) [To apply, please contact existing bankers e.g. DBS, OCBC, UOB]

- Enhanced from 1 Apr 2020 to 31 Mar 2020
- Max loan quantum of \$1 mil (increased from \$600k previously), with max repayment period of 5 years
- Government's risk share: 90% (applies to loans initiated from 8 Apr 2020 to 31 Mar 2021)
- Interest rate: subject to PFIs
- Coys may request for deferment of principle repayment for 1 year, subject to assessment by PFIs

3. Income Tax Rebates and Support [No application required]

- Corporate Income Tax rebate of <u>25%</u> capped at \$15,000 for YA2020
- Push back income tax payments for 3 months companies pay income tax for FY2019 profits from July 2020 instead of Apr 2020



Rental Support

4. Rental Waivers [No application required]

ENHANCED - 26 May

- Government tenants will get 4 months' worth of rental waiver
- Commercial SME tenants (e.g. F&B, retail outlets) will get up to 4 months' worth of rental waiver (up to 2 months from the govt and up to 2 months from landlords)
- SME tenants may repay rental arrears through instalments

5. Property Tax Rebates [No application required]

- Landlords of commercial properties (e.g. F&B, Retail) will receive 100% property tax rebate
- Landlords of non-residential properties (e.g. office, industrial) will receive 30% property tax rebate
- Laws to ensure property owners pass on Property Tax rebate to tenants

6. COVID-19 (Temporary Measures) Bill [To check with MinLaw on how the law applies to specific cases]

- New bill allows businesses to defer certain contractual obligations for ~6 months (e.g. landlords cannot terminate leases or evict tenants, allows suspension of rental payments, paying loans or completing work)
- Covers obligations to be performed on/after 1 Feb 2020 for contracts entered before 25 March 2020

7. Enhanced Jobs Support Scheme (JSS) [No application required]

ENHANCED - 26 May

- Total JSS support period extended to <u>10 months</u> from Oct 2019 to Aug 2020
- Wage support of <u>75%</u> for each local worker up to a qualifying wage ceiling of \$4,600 in April and May 2020, firms not allowed to resume operations will continue to receive 75% wage support until Aug 2020 or when they can re-open, whichever is earlier
- Shareholder-directors with assessable income up to S\$100,000 are eligible for JSS
- Co-funding of wages at 25% for each local worker (SG/PR) from Oct Dec 2019, Feb-Aug 2020
- Beauty svcs companies with physical retail front and severely affected may submit an appeal to IRAS for consideration of higher base tier of JSS support

8. Foreign Worker Levy (FWL) Relief [No application required]



- Waiver of FWL due in April, May and June 2020, 50% waiver for July 2020 if biz ops suspended
- FWL rebate of \$750 in April, May, June 2020 and \$375 rebate in July from levies paid this year for each work pass holder

9. Enhanced Absentee Payroll (AP) [To check with training course providers on the courses eligible]

- Enhanced rates 90% of hourly salaries (increased from 80%) at an increased cap of \$10 per hour (increased from \$7.50)
- This will apply to all courses that are eligible for absentee payroll funding e.g. selected courses by SSG-appointed CET Centres or certifiable courses by other SSG-approved training providers

• Enhanced hiring incentive of ~\$12,000 per worker for employers that hire local workers who have completed eligible reskilling and training schemes.

11. Self-Employed Income Relief Scheme (SIRS) [Check with NTUC for further assistance]

 To help self-employed persons tide through this period of economic uncertainty, eligible persons will receive S\$9000 over 3 tranches in May, July and Oct 2020.

12. <u>Job Redesign Place and Train for Retail</u> [To apply, contact WSG or Singapore Institute of Retail Studies]

- Up to 6 months salary support (up from 3 months) at the following rates:
 - Standard: Up to 70% of monthly salaries capped at \$2,000 per month
 - For Singapore Citizens aged 40 and above: up to 90% of monthly salaries capped at \$3,000 per month
- Companies must have a clear plan on how to redesign old job roles into new ones. New job roles should also be offered monthly gross salaries of at least \$1,800 after the programme

13. <u>SGUnited Jobs and Skills Package</u> [To participate, please approach WSG or SSG for more details of each specific initiative in the package]



- \$2 billion announced by the Govt to create close to 100,000 jobs, traineeships, and training opportunities
 - SGUnited Jobs: 40,000 new jobs, with 25,000 offered by the private sector and 15,000 offered by public sector
 - SGUnited Traineeships: 21,000 traineeships to help local first-time jobseekers gain valuable relevant experience in high-demand areas
 - SGUnited Mid-Career Traineeships: 4,000 traineeships to help local jobseekers aged 40 to 60 gain new skills and start new careers
 - SGUnited Skills: 30,000 local jobseekers can upgrade their skills while looking for a job, with training allowance of \$1,200 per month to cover basic expenses



Business Transformation & Capability Building

14. SkillsFuture Enterprise Credit (SFEC) [No application required; Coys who fulfil the eligibility criteria will be informed]

- SFEC encourages employers to invest in enterprise and workforce transformation.
- Coys can tap on SFEC to defray out-of-pocket (OOP) expenses one off \$10,000 credit per firm to cover up to 90% of OOP expenses
- Supportable progs which SFEC can be tapped on include: Productivity Solutions Grant, ESG Enterprise Development Grant, ESG Market Readiness Assistance Grant, WSG PCP, Place-and-train programme, job redesign initiatives

15. Productivity Solutions Grant – Job Redesign (PSG-JR) [Apply on Business Grants Portal]

- Work with pre-approved consultants to redesign work processes, tasks and responsibilities to make jobs more productive and attractive to employees
- Up to <u>70%</u> funding capped at \$30,000 per company
- Coys can tap on SFEC to defray out-of-pocket (OOP) expenses one off \$10,000 credit per firm, to cover up to 90% of OOP expenses





- 16. Enhanced Enterprise Development Grant (EDG) [To apply, please discuss with ESG and submit application on BGP1
 - From 1 Apr to 31 Dec 2020, support level will be raised from up to 70% to up to 80% for all projects relating to (i) Productivity, (ii) Innovation and (iii) Market Access.

17. Enhanced Productivity Solutions Grant (PSG) [Apply for PSG on Business Grants Portal]

- From 1 Apr 2020 to 31 Dec 2020, support level will be raised from 70% to 80%
- Scope of pre-approved digital solutions under PSG will be expanded to help SMEs implement safe distancing and business continuity measures. PSG will cover:
 - a) Online collaboration tools
 - b) Virtual meeting and telephony tools
 - Queue management systems
 - Temperature screening solutions

- ❖ Working Capital: SME Working Capital Loan – maximum loan quantum of \$1 million and Temporary Bridging Loan with interest rate capped at 5% p.a.
- ❖ Rental: ~4 months' worth of rental waiver and flexible rental payment for businesses facing cash flow challenges

RETAIN & DEVELOP MY EMPLOYEES

- Enhanced JSS support (10 months)
 - ~\$3,450 for each local worker in April to June
 - \$1,150-\$2,300 per month for the remaining 7 months
- ❖ Waiver and rebates of Foreign Worker Levy in Apr to June, 50% in July for businesses which are unable to resume operations
- Redeployment programmes to retain & reskill local employees e.g. PSG-JR

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
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
